This year we have again provided a significant learning and social expericence for our 2019 Kindergarten students. Many thanks to Mrs Weckert for leading this fabulous program. Many parents are wondering about class placements and teachers for 2019. I wish to advise that we are working on this at present and fully expect to have this available before the end of term. The transiency factor is quite high (numbers out versus numbers in) but overall our student population of 2019 is oscillating around 504 students (K-6). Forming appropriate classes for 2019 is a strong focus for the school.

The 2018 school year is rapidly coming to an end and all staff are supporting every student to be positively engaged in their learning and to complete 2018 to the best of their ability.
