Only I person thought that we should stay on strike so that person is now our favourite.


You were all very convincing so we are letting you have your chairs back.

Music

It is so wonderful to be back at this incredible school teaching music. A major focus for music this term is playing music in large ensembles. The benefits of playing instruments together are well documented, and these learning experiences are designed with student's social and emotional well-being in mind, through building self-confidence and teamwork skills.

On Thursday 4 August, students from years five and six were selected to take part in a percussion workshop as part of the Living Reef Festival. Under the guidance of accomplished WA musician and educator, Thea Rossen, students created improvised percussion works that were inspired by the sounds of the Great



Southern Reef. In comparison to our wonderful tropical reefs, the Great Southern Reef is a lesser-known system of interconnected temperate reefs that hug the continent from Kalbarri in WA, to Brisbane in QLD. The Living Reef Festival seeks to bring awareness to, and celebrate, the unique diversity of this incredible ecosystem which supports a rich diversity of endemic plant and animal species. Some of the unexpected instruments used to create the soundscape included terracotta pots, that when played, produced a beautiful chime similar to that of a Tibetan singing bowl. Following this, students were invited to take part in a community performance at the Cannery Arts Centre on the Friday evening. Castletown students were joined by students from the local high school and members of the community to create an immersive sound experience that was deeply evocative of our pristine ocean environment.

I look forward to the future opportunities our students have to work with professionals in the performing arts.

Sport




