School Contributions and Charges

The School Contributions and Charges schedule will provide you with information about the costs associated with your child/children attending Castletown Primary School in 2023. The Castletown Primary School Board endorses the schedule of Contributions and Charges each year. The information has been broken into four sections and will allow you to calculate all the costs that you may incur throughout the year.

SECTION 1 Contributions

The contribution amount that parents are being asked to pay has been set in accordance with the School Education Regulations 2000 at \$60 per child (approximately \$1.50 per week) and \$30 per child for Kindergarten students.

The funds collected will be used to supplement school expenditure in the curriculum learning areas. While contributions are voluntary, the quality of our teaching and learning program will be maximised when each family makes its contribution and supplements funding gained from other sources, including the State and Commonwealth Governments.

SECTION 2 Charges for Extra Cost Optional Components

These are for participation in a number of important school activities. A breakdown of estimated expected charges for your child's participation in excursions, incursions, camps and activities for 2023 has been included in the schedule below. Detail on charges collected in previous years has guided the formation of the charges schedule.

Students will incur costs when they are involved in a particular activity. Costs have been kept to a minimum and the amounts indicated on the schedule represent the maximum to be charged for all scheduled activities.

Please note that these are not new charges but merely an estimate of expected or planned charges based on what parents have paid in previous years.

As in the past, payment for each activity will be requested at the time of the event/activity occurring.

The charges schedule includes costs associated with:

- > Specific learning activities available to **all** students but conditional on a payment being made eg incursions (visiting groups/performers), excursions, camps etc
- > Specific learning activities only available to **selected** students but conditional on payment being made eg PEAC, Instrumental Music
- ➤ Other activities available to groups of students but conditional on a payment being made eg Graduation Function and Graduation Shirt

Table 2 - Personal Items

Description	Examples		
Type 1: Items for personal use in the Educational program			
This describes the items which students need for use in lessons. These items are outlined on a Personal Items List (Booklist) prepared by the school. Personal items can be purchased from any supplier.	Pens, rulers, crayons, markers, scissors, glue, scrapbooks, files, calculators, pads and exercise books, earphones, workbooks, protractor etc		
Type 2: Other personal items			
This category includes items which are needed for children at school.	Dress code or school uniform items and footwear Sports clothing, School bag, Art shirt, Library bag		
Type 3: Other services			
This includes services provided by the school but which are not directly part of the educational program.	Graduation T Shirts, Graduation Function School Photographs Student Leadership Conference		

Your child will need to have the items listed on the Personal List 2023 in his/her possession each school day in order to maximise participation in the learning program. The quantities indicated are estimates of what we expect your child to use during the course of the year. Please note that this is a guide only as consumption will vary from child to child and it may be necessary to replace some items, such as pencils, throughout the year. Your child may have some of the items from the previous year, and these may not need to be purchased new every year.
