Semester 1 Reports

Reports will be sent home via email on Friday. Please ensure you have updated any changes to email addresses to the school office asap. A reminder that sometimes they will go to your Spam/Junk folder so please check there before contacting the school. A reminder that the link expires after 6 weeks so please download the reports prior to then.

English and Maths Tick Sheets – Information for Parents

On Friday, we will be sending home the English and Maths tick sheets that go along with your child's Semester 1 report.

These tick sheets show the Year-level curriculum content covered in:

- **English** Reading and Viewing, Writing, and Speaking and Listening
- **Mathematics** Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry, and Statistics and Probability

Some areas on the tick sheets have been greyed out. This means those topics were either not taught during Semester 1, or were only introduced in the final two weeks of Term 2 (after reports were completed). These areas will be covered and assessed in Semester 2.

Top Ten Maths Column – What It Means

You'll also notice an extra column on the Maths tick sheet titled Top Ten Maths Focus. This relates to our new hands-on maths program, Top Ten Maths, which all classes have been using this year.

At the start of each unit, students completed a diagnostic test covering a range of maths concepts from previous, current, and future year levels. If a significant number of students showed gaps in understanding, teachers have taken time to teach those earlier skills to ensure students have a strong foundation.

Because maths concepts build upon one another, it's important students understand the basics before moving on to more advanced skills. If a concept has been ticked in the Top Ten Maths Focus column, it means your child is currently being taught that earlier concept to help them get ready for the expected year-level content.

Please be aware that, as a result of this more detailed assessment approach, some students may receive a lower grade in Mathematics compared to previous years. This is part of our commitment to developing a clearer picture of each student's strengths and areas for growth in maths.

CHAPLAIN'S CHAT

The importance of sleep

I have seen various memes on social media about sleep being like a mobile phone battery on 5% or even a car fuel and oil levels. These may seem to imply that if you just fill it up it goes back to full functionality and can run as per normal. In the short term 'making up' for some missed sleep may be possible but over time, not getting the amount of sleep your body needs can have serious consequences.

Lack of enough sleep can make it harder for us to focus and think clearly, and we might feel tired or sluggish during the day. We are more likely to feel irritable.

So why get a good night's sleep?

Sleep helps with focus and concentration.

Sleep helps people regulate their emotions and better manage the physical and psychological effects of stress.

Healthy sleep supports sound judgment and good decision making.

Sleep is vital for our children's and adolescents' wellbeing. Sleep supports healthy development of the body and mind. Evidence shows that children and adolescents who do not get enough sleep have more trouble learning. They are less attentive and motivated, have poor problem-solving, more confusion, increased irritability, reduced memory, impaired communication, slower processing of information, poorer judgement, diminished reaction times and more indifference. Lack of sleep can also lead to behaviour mood issues, impacting negatively upon relationships, empathy and leading

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to mental health difficulties such as anxiety and depressed mood. In Australia, the number of children and adolescents who are sleep-deprived is rapidly growing due to our lifestyle behaviours.

It is up to us to make sure they get to bed early with as little distraction as possible.


