Music Programme

Orff and Kodaly approaches

Developing the elements of music through singing, playing, creating, exploring, performing, responding, listening, recording, communicating

Approach across the year levels:

- Year 1: Improvise untuned percussion, voice, body movements
- Year 2: Explore and experiment- tuned percussion, drums
- Year 3: Improvise, create, explore, record, communicate- tuned percussion, boomwhackers
- Year 4: Create compositions, develop aural and theory skills, convey mea ning and purpose, reflect, respond, cultures and contexts- boomwhackers and simple arrangements using tuned percussion, ipads
- Year 5: Musical features and styles, giving and receiving feedback, work individually and in groups, reflect and respond to music from different times and places- ukuleles, all instruments, ipads
- Year 6: Manipulate the elements of music to create simple compositions and arrangements, imitating some elements of musical styles- garage band, all instruments, ipads


PROMOTING POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR – PBIS REWARDS & CASTLE POINTS

During music I like to acknowledge every child every lesson.

For this purpose, I sing hello to every child and they sing back to me. I also catch them following expectations and get them to pin their badge on the Magic Tree. They all wear their own self-made badge.

We goal set together before the lesson begins, then once it's under way the children get to place their badge on the branches of the magic tree after being acknowledged for something they have done really well, progressing from Champion to Superstar then King Of The Pack.

We celebrate these achievements at the end of each lesson and children are awarded points for their position on the tree. King of the Pack gets to choose from the following: A phone call home, principal's award, visit to the deputy, photo with a friend, celebration popper, elephant dance, treasure chest or music sticker.





REPORTING AND ASSESSMENT

- Assessment is ongoing
- Videos are taken during class improvisations, explorations and performances.
- These are closely viewed by myself and children are assessed against criteria related to that task.
- I will attempt to put these videos onto See-Saw but I will need to look into it a little more.
- Children are also asked to perform individually on audiation tasks which are recorded straight away as they occur.

CHOIRS

2021

JUNIOR CHOIR- comprised of all year 3 students – Rooms 7,8 and 21

Goals: to develop vocal skills, performance etiquette, personal discipline, teamwork, a sense of joy that comes from singing, memory, pitch and rhythmic skills, co-operative learning skills and the joy of performing

SENIOR CHOIR- comprised of volunteer students from years 4-6- Rooms 9,10,11, 12, 13,14, and 22. Goals: to develop a sense of belonging and teamwork, extend vocal skills to include harmony, counter melody, rounds, variations on the elements of music and solo and small group performances.

In order to encourage choirs to blend as a team I will be providing experiences that draw the team together like: performances both inside and outside the school environment, cook special Mrs Baker cakes, hold a movie night, have choir picnics and go on excursions.

Performances will include: Music Festival, Aged Care, school assemblies, school special events and some community singing.



INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC- IMSS

The instruments on offer for children at Castletown Primary School are: **BRASS, CLARINET, FLUTE AND GUITAR.** I will be testing all of the year 4's at the beginning of term 4. The process involves all year 4 students sitting an aural (listening) test designed by IMSS to gather data on their aptitude in music. This same test will be administered state wide in every public school by school music specialists.

The results, along with other information, will be used to determine children who are suitable to take part in the instrumental music programme at Castletown Primary School for the following year.

Teachers will also be asked for recommendations based on their knowledge of the child's work ethic and commitment to learning in the classroom. Music report data will also be used. All data will be considered before children are shortlisted, then offers will be sent home.

Lessons will take place during class time once a week and children will be expected to practise at home. The lessons are free of charge but an instrument hire fee of around \$110 will be charged for the first year unless a student has their own instrument.

It is expected that students who are offered a position are prepared to consider commitment until at least the end of Year 10, and will plan to continue music studies at a public secondary school that offers the instrumental music program for their instrument.
