Dear Parents and Carers

Mentally Healthy WA

There is not long now to the end of term. I am sure I'm not the only one finding the cold weather a little hard to take – yet winter has only just started! Karen and I are heading off to the Pilbara for a bit of sun and warmth, which will hopefully carry us through to Spring. I hope you and your family have some quality time planned for the holiday break. Please note that **Term 3 resumes on Monday July 19** for students, there is no school development day on the first day. **There will be a school development day on Friday August 20**.

Student Reports: These will be emailed out late next week. Please ensure the school has your current email address. Paper copies can be provided on request.

Uniform Shop: I wish to sincerely thank Mrs Sandra Prosser for her wonderful work as coordinator of the P&C Uniform Shop for the past year. Sandra has provided a great service, always prepared to go out of her way to help families when needed. Mrs Jasmine Tate is kindly taking over from Sandra, and we know she will be great for this role. Speaking of the P&C, **Friday July 23**rd **is P&C Day**. We are planning how to acknowledge the great support we receive from our P&C, in particular those on the Executive and actively involved.

Traffic and Parking: You may have noticed some work being done by Ian and the boys from Wrinkly Tin, to modify the school's fences near McGlade Way. This is to provide space for cars to park more safely, and enable children and adults to enter and leave the school grounds safely. This is the first step in some planned improvements to the area, and I have spoken again with the Shire about how we can further enhance safety for all. I ask that children and adults use the small gate near the staff carpark entrance.

I have noticed more parents using the staff carpark. This has caused some of our support staff who work part-time to be unable to find somewhere to park. They may need to double-park to avoid running late, which may well prevent other vehicles being able to leave.

Voluntary Contribution Rate: Thank you to all those families who have paid their children's voluntary contribution charges for this year. We have now passed the 50% mark, which has not been achieved at Castletown Primary for some time. It is not too late to pay yours if you have not already, and push this figure even higher. Be in it!

Excursion Payments: This week the Year 5 students attended a brilliant Hip-hop workshop at the Civic Centre, which they thoroughly enjoyed. Unfortunately, some children missed out due to late payment. There is a lot of planning involved in an off-site excursion, and our student numbers and information must be accurate prior to the event, so please ensure you meet the deadline on any payments.

Kindergarten Change: There will be a change in the Kindergarten area next semester. Mrs Kate Palmer in EC7 will sadly be relinquishing her position as class teacher. In addition, we have a number of parents of Kindy children seeking a place for their child, including several new to town, so we will be starting a fourth Kindy class, which will share EC7 with the existing class on the other days. I am pleased to advise that we have secured an experienced early years teacher from Kalgoorlie, Mrs Karen Ritchie, for this class.

Managing Behaviour in the Modern Era: This week, two things occurred in our school which illustrated for me the way that technology has enabled us to do things better and smarter, even in an area like student behaviour.

First, I was walking near the staff room and three children came through the walkway. Two were running, and one walking. Ten years ago I might have called the two runners to stop and spoken to them about walking through that area for safety. Instead, I called over the walker, took out my mobile phone and used our PBIS Rewards app to give her a point for being responsible. Hopefully, the other two noticed this and will walk through there in future. Catching them being good, and reinforcing and acknowledging the behaviour we desire, will hopefully have a more lasting effect.

Second, there was an issue with a group of students playing on the oval. One boy was reported to the duty teacher as having hit another. When the recounts from the group varied, Mr McLaren decided to check if there was any available CCTV footage, which proved very useful. He was able to watch the footage with the students and review with them exactly what happened, and it was most enlightening. This turned the incident into a most productive learning experience, with positive and fair outcomes for all involved. Whilst the cameras are not intended for this purpose, they have on occasions saved us time and ensured fairness prevails.


In the Zone Performance and Workshop

Our biggest news is that we have finally become Guardians of not only one but two Orangutans! Their names are Sam and Cupcake.


In 2013, female Orangutan Sam was rescued from appalling conditions in a Malaysian zoo. After initial care at the SOCP Orangutan Quarantine Centre in North Sumatra, she was soon transferred to the Bukit Tigapuluh (BTP) rehabilitation and release program in Jambi. Despite her tough start in life, the BTP wanted to give Sam



every chance to live in the jungle. They knew this would be a long journey since she had spent her whole life in captivity. Sam was housed in a pre-release enclosure and began her rehabilitation journey. This included being given forest foods such as fruits, leaves and termites to eat and foliage to learn how to build a nest. She could also watch and learn from other Orangutans nearby climbing in the canopy and foraging as they participated in forest school outings. Then, in 2015, they were surprised and excited to discover that Sam was pregnant. However, Sam's pregnancy changed everything. Despite her progress and plans to release her in the near future, Sam would be too vulnerable to return to the wild while pregnant and for some time after the baby's birth.

Little Cupcake was born in June 2015 and Sam has been a devoted and attentive mother. She has successfully nursed baby Cupcake and introduced him to solid food by first chewing it and then passing it to Cupcake to eat. Cupcake is an active, cheeky and adventurous little boy! The pair have been working towards freedom and a new life, by learning the skills they'll need for independence and survival in the wild.

Our guardianship of Sam and Cupcake will help them to find their jungle freedom by supporting jungle school training, food and medical costs and intensive post-release monitoring to ensure that they are both safe and thriving in their true jungle home.


