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Dear Parents

We have had a very smooth and successful transition back to school and all look forward to an exciting, safe and happy 2018. To date we have enrolled 88 new students (including 67 Kindy) and farewelled about the same number (including 54 Year 6 students). Currently, we have 558 students enrolled. A very big welcome to all new families to the school.

Many thanks to all staff for the many hours worked to set up classrooms, realign resource centres, set out timetables and to be so well prepared for the start of the year. It really has been a smooth start.

Exciting things happening:

- French Mrs Lee-Steere has commenced formal French lessons with all Year 3 students.
- Friday sport each and every Friday we have timetabled sport for both Years 1 3 and the Years 4
 6 students.
- 31 Applicants for Student Leader positions were received. The selection panel of Principal, Deputy Principal, School Board Chair and a parent representative on the School Board short listed 10 successful applicants. The Student Leadership group was selected from this process and will be formally announced at our first assembly. Many of the applications were outstanding and I thank every student who nominated and their parents for supporting them so well.
- New furniture for Rooms 6, 7 & 8 has been delivered and it looks terrific.
- Nominations for School Board positions becoming vacant have been called for. There are 5 vacant positions for parents with nominations closing at 3pm Friday 23rd February.
- We have had our first incursion. School Performance Tours presented 'Too Cool for Bullies'. This will complement the work we are doing to further develop resilience in a student cohort.
- Our new STEM room is set up and fully functioning. Mrs Fetherston is providing significant opportunities for students to use technology to both create and solve problems.
- Instrumental music is again being offered and a special room has been set up to both support students and the Instrumental Music teachers.

Staffing Update:

- Welcome to Miss Bertola teaching Year I in Room 9 and welcome back to Mrs Rose (Year 4 Room 2) and Mrs Maguire (PP on Wednesdays).
- Mrs Kidd and Mr Barter are on long service leave.
- Mr Palmer is on sick leave and currently so too is Mrs Ainsworth.

Assemblies:

- At Castletown Primary School, assemblies provide a valuable opportunity for our school community to come together to share, reflect and celebrate.
- Assemblies will be held fortnightly, alternating with Years 4-6 and P-3.
- Each class is afforded the opportunity to organise and present one assembly throughout the year.
- At a whole school assembly, at the end of each term, 2 x Outstanding Achievement Certificates will be presented for the most academically outstanding students in each class.

Attendance:

Attending school is very important for student success. Students with an attendance less than 90% are at risk. At each assembly we will acknowledge the class with the highest attendance rate for the period between each assembly. Also students with 100% attendance will be recognised at the whole school assembly each term.


