At the Green's, the students viewed beef cattle in the yards, wheat crops growing, crushed canola seeds to make oil and exploring the machinery. The children enjoyed sitting in the tractor and admiring the giant wheels and loader bucket.

At the Davies' farm the hungry children had a sausage sizzle and ate delicious treats supplied by parents. They listened to an Aboriginal story about emus and looked at an emu egg. They also explored the vegetable garden and bird aviaries, watched bales of hay being unrolled to feed the cows and sheep, saw a lamb being bottle fed and learnt about alpacas.

The freedom of exploring and learning about farming in our community was an invaluable experience for all. A huge thank you to the Green and Davies families for a wonderful day.
