#### Principal's Message

Today's Principal's Message includes information about: the National Education Initiative; Australian Student Wellbeing Framework and the EC2/Room 1 Assembly.

**Dear Parents** 

Castletown Primary School, through its commitment to promote student wellbeing, signed up earlier this year to a Department of Education initiative to support the delivery of Mental Health programs in 300 schools across Western Australia. Funding is provided as a targeted initiative for a period of 4 years and staff member Mrs Garvey was appointed to coordinate the program.

This week, the Federal Government transitioned the KidsMatter Framework to introduce the National Education Initiative and our program here at Castletown Primary School is aligned through our Department of Education to the national initiative.

In that context, our school has formed an Action Committee and has a teacher from each of the 4 Phase of Learning Teams, the Principal, Program Coordinator and importantly a parent member of the School Board working collaboratively to develop the initiative in our school.

Currently, the Action Team is researching a recommended program to implement here at Castletown. The "Act Belong Commit" program is specifically being considered as it has demonstrated capacity to provide our students with the opportunities to look after their mental health and to increase their self-esteem, confidence and resilience. It gives a strong focus to including teachers and families in the strategies.

For your information I have attached to the Newsletter the Government's newly released <u>"Australian Student Wellbeing Framework"</u> that will drive Castletown Primary School's focus to improve student wellbeing.

I am particularly delighted that at a recent meeting of the School Board, it was agreed to include a focus on improving student wellbeing in the School's Vision. This will give particular clarity to framing a connection in the School's Business Plan and priorities.

In closing, I wish to thank teachers Ms Young and Ms Stokes for the fabulous effort they made to support their cohort of PP and Year 1 students to host their first Assembly yesterday. These young students were confident, spoke well and showed that they felt safe and happy in the spotlight. Congratulations to both classes and their teachers.

Year 2 and Year 4 NAPLAN Online Support Program

Next year our Year 3 and Year 5 students will be completing their NAPLAN

assessment online. To ensure that our students have the ICT skills to

confidently complete their assessment next year, the school has implemented a

program of support to the Year 2 and Year 4 students for Term 4.Students and

teachers completed a self-assessment survey of the 7 identified key ICT Skills for NAPLAN. These include:

- 1. Locate and select an answer
- 2. Type an answer
- 3. Read the screen and navigate web pages
- 4. Manipulate objects on screen
- 5. Read and comprehend digital texts
- 6. Plan and compose text using word processing
- 7. Listen using a headset.

Students will now be using the NAPLAN Online Public Demonstration Site to explore how the questions are posed and how to answer them.

Identified areas of concern from the survey and teacher observation will be targeted to ensure that students have opportunities to develop their skills in a safe, supportive environment.

in an emergency situation. Year 3 students now have a better understanding about Protective behaviours, learning there is a difference in keeping "safe" and "unsafe" secrets. The senior classes explored bullying and empathy amongst young people. Thank you to WA Police for supporting this program.

From the Kindy/Pre-Primary Incursion:

"Kora the Ambulance Bear, Lilly, Timmy and Ben taught the Kindy and Pre-Primary students about different types of emergencies. They talked about the difference between a big emergency and a small problem. If it is a big emergency we need help right away and we call 000. When an ambulance officer answers the phone they ask us questions and explain DRS ABC! If we need a police office or the fire department we call 000 too.

In an emergency the officer on the phone will ask us questions like, is the person in danger? Are they breathing? What are the person's symptoms?

When we are on the phone to an emergency office if we stay calm and talk clearly we are being an emergency hero - helping a person in need."

This term we are trialling 2 Lego Engineers Clubs after school. Students in Years 3-4 and Years 5-6 were nominated by their teacher if they have demonstrated an interest, aptitude or enthusiasm for STEM engineering projects, lego and/or coding.Students will participate in STEM Lego activities

that encourage the 21st Century Skills of problem solving, critical thinking, collaborating and communicating.

The school has recently purchased class sets of a variety of Lego Education Resources, including programmable Lego and these resources will be available across all year levels from K-6.

Our Year 3-4 Lego Engineer students will be using the Simple and Powered Machines (a Woolworths Earn and Learn Reward we redeemed) and the new Lego Wedo.

Our Year 5-6 Lego Engineer students will initially be using the Lego Mindstorms NXT but we are eagerly anticipating the arrival of the new Lego EV3 resources in our order.

After a successful outcome from this term's trial, it is anticipated that more Lego Engineer Opportunities will be available in 2019.
