9. At the Royal Adelaide Show, the rides were closed last Friday due to very bad weather. There was a rainfall of 31 mm. How many centimetres and millimetres is that?

10. **Open-ended Question:** A recent study of 1,032 parents showed that, when reading bedtime stories, a third of parents skip a page or two to get the story finished earlier. If that statistic is true, about how many of a group of 5,000 parents would read an entire story, without skipping any of it?
